



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST HAWAII JOBS AND MAKE HAWAII COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Hawaii jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 3,100 Hawaii jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Hawaii families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY HAWAII JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Hawaii set to lose more than 3,100 jobs.
- Nearly 1,800 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Hawaii if the House-passed bill is enacted.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN HAWAII, MAKE HAWAII'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average Hawaii undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$700.
- More than 650 Hawaii children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Hawaii could lose upwards of \$8.7 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact approximately 36,000 potential Hawaiian workers.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE HAWAII LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Hawaii by \$800,000.
- H.R. 1 reduces Hawaii homeland security investments by nearly \$800,000, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Hawaiians safe.
- Honolulu could lose more than \$400,000 in Transit Security Grants under H.R. 1, while the Hawaii Civil Defense Division would lose more than \$2 million in Port Security Grants.
