



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST KENTUCKY JOBS AND MAKE KENTUCKY COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Kentucky jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 9,500 Kentucky jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Kentucky families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY KENTUCKY JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Kentucky set to lose more than 9,500 jobs.
- More than 2,000 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Kentucky if the House-passed bill is enacted.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN KENTUCKY, MAKE KENTUCKY'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average Kentucky undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$700.
- Nearly 4,000 Kentucky children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Kentucky could lose more than \$47 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact nearly 40,000 potential Kentucky workers.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE KENTUCKY LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Kentucky by approximately \$1.7 million.
- H.R. 1 reduces Kentucky's homeland security investments by nearly \$1 million, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Kentucky families safe.
