



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST NORTH CAROLINA JOBS AND MAKE NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine North Carolina jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 21,000 North Carolina jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of North Carolina families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY NORTH CAROLINA JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with North Carolina set to lose nearly 21,000 jobs.
- More than 3,100 community health center jobs will be eliminated in North Carolina if the House-passed bill is enacted.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN NORTH CAROLINA, MAKE NORTH CAROLINA'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average North Carolina undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$650.
- Nearly 5,300 North Carolina children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- North Carolina could lose upwards of \$92.7 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact approximately 30,000 potential North Carolina workers.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE NORTH CAROLINA LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for North Carolina by \$4 million.
- H.R. 1 reduces North Carolina's homeland security investments by nearly \$1.9 million, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep North Carolina families safe.
- The Charlotte Area Transit System will lose more than \$200,000 in Transit Security Grants under H.R. 1.
- The N.C. Department of Crime Control and Public Safety will lose more than \$2.6 million in Port Security Grants for Wilmington and Morehead City.
