



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST NEBRASKA JOBS AND MAKE NEBRASKA COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Nebraska jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 5,100 Nebraska jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Nebraska families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY NEBRASKA JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Nebraska set to lose nearly 5,100 jobs.
- More than 600 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Nebraska if the House-passed bill is enacted.
- A \$4.9 million federal transportation grant to help rehabilitate a rail line in Dawes and Sheridan Counties, creating jobs and boosting the local economy, would be eliminated.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN NEBRASKA, MAKE NEBRASKA'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average Nebraska undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$600.
- More than 1,200 Nebraska children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Nebraska could lose upwards of \$7 million in job training investments under H.R.1.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE NEBRASKA LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Nebraska by nearly \$1 million.
- H.R. 1 reduces Nebraska's homeland security investments by nearly \$800,000, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Nebraskans safe.
