



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST WISCONSIN JOBS AND MAKE WISCONSIN COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Wisconsin jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 14,700 Wisconsin jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Wisconsin families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY WISCONSIN JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Wisconsin set to lose more than 14,700 jobs.
- More than 3,000 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Wisconsin if the House-passed bill is enacted.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN WISCONSIN, MAKE WISCONSIN'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average Wisconsin undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$650.
- More than 3,000 Wisconsin children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Wisconsin could lose upwards of \$45 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact approximately 23,500 potential Wisconsin workers.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE WISCONSIN LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Wisconsin by more than \$2 million.
- H.R. 1 reduces Wisconsin's homeland security investments by more than \$1 million, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Wisconsin's families safe.
- Pierce County will lose over \$400,000 in Port Security Grants under H.R. 1.
- Sturgeon Bay's Door County Sheriff's Department will lose over \$100,000 in Port Security Grants.
