



## **REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST WYOMING JOBS AND MAKE WYOMING COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE**

*There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Wyoming jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 1,500 Wyoming jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Wyoming families would be less safe.*

### **REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY WYOMING JOBS**

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Wyoming set to lose more than 1,500 jobs.
- More than 200 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Wyoming if the House-passed bill is enacted.

### **REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN WYOMING, MAKE WYOMING'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE**

- Under H.R.1, the average Wyoming undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$650.
- More than 300 Wyoming children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Wyoming could lose more than \$2 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact over 19,000 potential Wyoming workers.

### **REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE WYOMING LESS SAFE**

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Wyoming by approximately \$300,000.
- H.R. 1 reduces Wyoming's homeland security investments by almost \$800,000, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Wyoming families safe.
