



How Project 2025 will harm women's reproductive freedom:

EXPOSED

The extreme Republican plan would drastically harm reproductive freedom, including access to women's healthcare.

- Paves the way for a national abortion ban.
 (p. 471)
- Ends access to medication abortion and any medical supplies that could be used in abortion care by misapplying an 1873 law that would allow for the regulation of mail. (p. 562)
- Creates criminal penalties for doctors and other health care providers who provide abortions, even in emergency situations.
- Reverses the FDA's decades-old approval of mifepristone, a medication that is used in around 60% of abortions in the U.S. In absence of a reversal, it would reinstate burdensome requirements to access this safe and effective medication. (p. 458)
- Prohibits federal funding for health clinics that provide vaccines, preventive care, mental health services, infectious disease screening, testing and treatment, and other services if that clinic also provides abortion care. (p. 472)
- Threatens protections for pharmacists who dispense medication abortion in accordance with their clinical responsibilities. (p. 496)

- Weakens hospital's obligations to provide emergency care to women who are pregnant, including abortions. (p. 474)
- Eliminates insurance coverage requirements for reproductive healthcare that include abortion, emergency contraceptives. (p. 472, 485)
- Undermines scientific and medical recommendations around family planning in prominent federal grant programs to favor ideological guidance. (p. 485)
- Abolishes the Gender Policy Council, a White House office focused on barriers that women and girls face including in economic security, health and education. (p. 62)
