



REPUBLICANS' RECKLESS SPENDING PLAN WOULD COST DELAWARE JOBS AND MAKE DELAWARE COMMUNITIES LESS SAFE

There is no disagreement that we need to cut spending. We believe that we need to do it in a responsible way so that we live within our means and can invest in the future, out-building, out-educating, and out-innovating our competitors in the world economy. But as the economy continues to recover from the deepest recession in a generation, we cannot afford to make dramatic and indiscriminate cuts that would undermine Delaware jobs and public safety. The reckless Republican spending plan would do just that - an estimated 2,200 Delaware jobs would be lost if H.R. 1 is enacted into law, and thousands of Delaware families would be less safe.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD DESTROY DELAWARE JOBS

- Independent, non-partisan analysis has found that H.R. 1 will cut 700,000 jobs through 2012, with Delaware set to lose more than 2,200 jobs.
- Nearly 350 community health center jobs will be eliminated in Delaware if the House-passed bill is enacted.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WOULD HURT EDUCATION IN DELAWARE, MAKE DELAWARE'S WORKFORCE LESS COMPETITIVE

- Under H.R.1, the average Delaware undergraduate with Pell college tuition assistance will see their assistance cut by more than \$600.
- Nearly 500 Delaware children will lose access to Head Start, an early education program that is proven to help students complete high school.
- Delaware could lose upwards of \$7 million in job training investments under H.R.1, which would impact approximately 6,000 potential Delaware workers.

REPUBLICAN SPENDING PLAN WILL MAKE DELAWARE LESS SAFE

- H.R. 1 reduces Byrne Justice Grants for Delaware by \$800,000.
- H.R. 1 reduces Delaware's homeland security investments by nearly \$800,000, hurting local law enforcement's ability to keep Delaware families safe.
- The Delaware Transit Corporation could lose more than \$660,000 in Transit Security Grants under H.R. 1, while the Delaware Bay area would lose \$10.7 million in Port Security Grants.
