

Families Depend on Mothers' Earnings: State- and County-Level Estimates of the Number of Families and Children Relying on Mothers' Earnings

Earlier this month, the Joint Economic Committee (JEC) issued a [report](#) entitled, “Mother’s Day Report: Paycheck Fairness Helps Families, Not Just Women,” showing that mothers’ earnings play a key role in supporting their families. Two-thirds of mothers work outside the home and one in three working mothers is the only income earner in her family. The report provided state-by-state estimates of the gender pay gap and the extent of mothers’ contribution to families wage and salary income. As a supplement, the JEC has produced the attached tables to illustrate the extent of children and families’ dependence on mothers’ wage earnings at the state and county level.

These tables provide state- and county-level estimates of the number of families and children who are dependent on their mother’s earnings. For purposes of this analysis, a mother is considered to be a contributor to her household’s earnings if she is in the labor force (either working or actively seeking work). Estimates are based on data from the 2010 American Community Survey for counties with populations of 65,000 people or greater; some counties are omitted because the estimates are not statistically reliable. Data were downloaded by the JEC Chairman’s staff using American Factfinder, the U.S. Census Bureau’s online data extraction tool.
